## **Firewise Spring Cleaning**

Ah, springtime! A fresh new start and a great time for some spring cleaning around your home and office. It is important to think of how you can make your surroundings "Firewise" to protect lives and property. This is a great time to assess old clutter that you may have laying around. Items such as leftover fire wood, tires, old furniture, and paper items can often accumulate into "trash piles" over the year and this creates a fire hazard, especially if close to your home in drought/wildfire season in Texas. Do some spring cleaning to clear out this clutter and if you need to keep these items be sure to store them in your garage, enclosed shed, or warehouse for safe keeping rather than near your home or under a deck.

Be sure to also clear your roof and gutters of leaves and debris, trim tree branches that overhang your house, and maintain a green lawn for 30' around your home to keep potential wildfires from spreading to your property. Firewise yards will have green grass, rocks, or sometimes just soil to create an empty area of land where the heated intensity of a wildfire cannot reach. You should avoid leaving deadwood or dense flammable vegetation around your home or office, and as a fail safe always have a couple of fire extinguishers (charged and ready) nearby in case of an emergency.
